The seminar is a great opportunity for Shriners and their Ladies to learn more about care, education, and research through formal presentations, workshops, and roundtables, led by representatives from all sectors of the Hospital. INTRODUCING MISS MADDIE ..

In this issue of the Mazol Connection we are pleased to introduce you to 5 year old Maddie, an OI patient from .Mount Pearl. Her Brittle Bone condition was first detected at three

months when local doctors detected abnormalities with her femur during a hip examination. Mom Kayla told us that Maddie's eyes also had excessive blue colouring around her eyeballs, which is sometimes a symptom of OI.

Maddie has already made 5 trips to Shriners Montreal and undergone surgery on 2 of those visits. She is regularly seen by Dr. Hamdy when at our Hospital, and greatly enjoys arriving at Montreal Airport and being greeted by Mike and Andre, the Patient drivers from Karnak Temple.

Maddie's Mom speaks highly of their Shriners Hospital experience, especially the way children are treated by staff. Things like having blood drawn are done in a much more relaxed manner, which is normally quite trying for small children. And, bone density scans, which are crucial for OI patients, are geared to the age of the patient.



On her most recent visit to Montreal Maddie and her Mom attended the Osteogenesis Imperfecta Conference which was an event focused on OI and organized by our Shriners Hospital and Canada's OI Foundation. It was described as a great opportunity to learn and to network with parents and children dealing with OI.

The 4th ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP & MARKETING CONFERENCE

The 4th Annual Membership and Marketing Conference by the Shriners International Education Foundation (SIEF) was a comprehensive event that focused on various themes and teachings. The three-day conference took place in Orlando FL and hosted over 400 delegates from all over North and South America. The conference featured 18 sessions including 3 keynote speakers, 5 marketing sessions, 5 membership sessions and 5 regional breakouts where we were afforded the opportunity to collaborate, share and learn from other Temples in our Region.



The conference kicked off with a keynote address by Ken Harvey, a former Professional NFL player and all-star who emphasized the importance of teamwork, focus, and the need to constantly refine our approach, drawing parallels between football and Freemasonry. He stressed the need for Freemasons to refine their approach on how they relate to, recruit, and retain new members, and to create a sense of urgency in what they are doing.

Presenters echoed this need to shift our approach in communicating with next generation of

potential members and professionals. There was a continued emphasis on the notion of an individual's return on investment (ROI) and the importance of person-to-person engagement. Community engagement was strongly encouraged and discussed as was the notion that Shrine International was founded on the precepts of "fun, fellowship and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth." We are a fraternity defined by fun, fellowship and philanthropy and we need to be proud of that heritage and celebrate it in everything we do.

Themes included creating a sense of cohesion in our Temples, building value for our members, and helping the new generation of Freemasons and Shriners see a value to the personal time they invest in being Freemasons and Shriners. Value, not only to them personally but the community as well. As Shriners, we need to understand our value center and how to speak to the different generations from a recruitment and retention standpoint.

During the conference we delved into the topic on online presence, the threats, and the opportunities as well as some tools and tips for effective social media communications. As live in a world of increasingly complex political and societal landscapes we discussed that with the importance of diversity of thought that comes in today's online world, we must be diligent in monitoring our privacy/security settings. All temples, clubs, units, and nobles must think before we post, everything we present to the public must reflect the values and tenants represented by the Fez. To support our online branding and communications, we were shown the valuable resources contained within FezCast and the newly restructured Digital Asset Management System (DAM). The "SI Standards Guidebook" was introduced and provides guidance, tools, and resources to give everyone in our organization the ability to be part of this movement by communicating consistently, with a unified vision.

One final theme central to this conference was the notion of being intentional in what we do as Freemasons and as Shriners. We discussed the need to consciously move away from holding meetings for the sake of meetings, but rather carefully plan meetings and events so that are enriching, productive and efficient use of people's time and effort where real value can be had from being a part of our great fraternity. We also must never forget to always have fun, and to respect and support one another.

I want to personally thank Ill. Sir Lloyd Collins and the Divan for supporting this worthwhile initiative and I look forward to helping the Nobles of Mazol Shriners to share all the great ways we are supporting our communities and each other.

The Harold W. Duffett Shriner's RV Park officially opened for the 2024 season on May 15th.

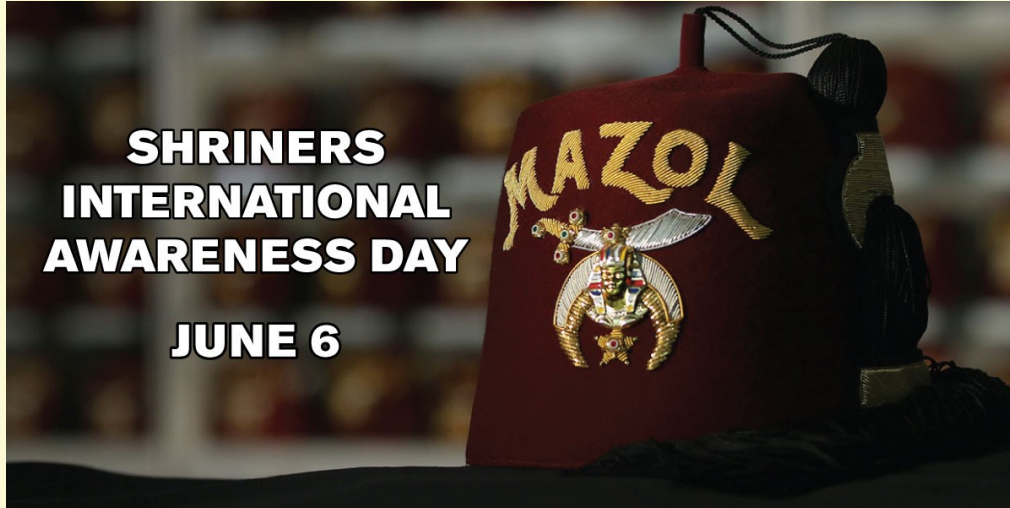

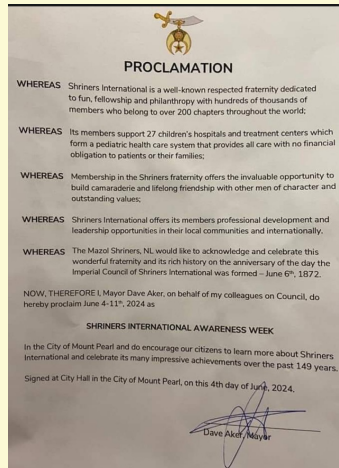
During our interview with Noble Kevin, he highlighted the challenges faced in attracting
